EQUITY AND INCLUSION

We believe in the young people at p:ear and in their unique, creative and powerful place in our community. In order to help youth live healthy and meaningful lives, p:ear must combat the structural and institutional systems and personal attitudes and behaviors that exist to create and perpetuate racial, social, economic inequities in our community.

p:ear respects and celebrates the diversity, creativity and strength of the p:ear community. Equity and inclusion are a priority across all parts of our organization from programs to administration to personal development. We commit to creating a culture of inclusion, self-reflection, and personal growth. POSITION SUMMARY

p:ear is seeking an Art and Music Program Coordinator for a full-time position. The selected candidate will be a self-initiating, creative leader, thinker, and organizer with a background and proficiency in working with youth, the arts, gallery curation, and community partnerships, with a love for outward facing community and capacity building. This position requires working on-site as well as frequent evenings and weekends pending programming. This position requires a high level desire and ability to attend and interact in community engagement and networking events.

This versatile, creative, proactive, and collaborative leader and artist is responsible for working directly with youth in helping them navigate systems to aid in transitioning out of homelessness; creating art and music based programmatic workshops and activities; working closely with program volunteers and guest artists; maintaining and procuring art supplies; curating the gallery; representing p:ear in the larger PDX community; and furthering p:ear's mission by building meaningful and healthy relationships with youth, volunteers, donors, and community members. This position requires direct service with youth and staff on the floor during open hours of Safe Space operations, while simultaneously balancing daily administrative duties, attending events, and continuously innovating opportunities for youth.

The Art Program Coordinator will work collaboratively with all staff and reports directly to the Program Director.

REQUIRED VALUES / COMPETENCIES:

- Must have the initiative and love for community building
- Desire to be in relationship with people and seek out new relationships / connections
- Committed to self-reflection and personal growth, with a high degree of humor and emotional intelligence
- Demonstrated experience working on issues of poverty and homelessness
- Commitment to youth-driven and youth-centered programming
- Creative Visionary
- Must be a positive and strong role model, have a collaborative, teamoriented work style, and strong strategic and problem-solving skills
- Highly proficient in working with youth experiencing severe levels of trauma

- Must be committed to non-violence, trauma informed care, through compassionate responses and restorative justice
- Must have awareness of one's own identity, an understanding of differences, and an excitement about building relationships cross-culturally
- Strong commitment to advancing equity and inclusion and creating and maintaining a diverse environment
- Ability to learn and build on the varying cultural and community norms of p:ear youth and the p:ear donor community
- Self-initiating, independent and highly motivated
- Able to work in a stressful, sometimes chaotic as well as physically and emotionally demanding environment
- Strong leadership skills with capacity to be deadline-oriented while balancing extensive programmatic visioning
- Willingness to take risks and seek innovative solutions

ESSENTIAL DUTIES / RESPONSIBILITIES Safe Space (Drop-In) Support:

- Staff Safe Space during hours of operations
- Develop healthy, mentoring relationships with youth
- Create a safe, supportive and structured environment
- Build and expand a dynamic and evolving art and music program
- Able to work effectively in a highly chaotic, unpredictable and loud environment
- Support program unity by participating in a team approach when providing services
- Build strong relationships / partnerships with volunteers and community partners
- Support onboarding and mentoring of new staff members
- Participate in daily scheduled activities and projects
- Together with other staff, prepare the facility each morning, clean and organize at end of work day
- Aid in taking in and organizing all incoming donations
- Work with other staff to support the general needs of the program and seek interdisciplinary opportunities for learning
- Assist with intakes and data entry for p:ear participants, including youth and volunteer attendance for daily open hours and activities such as workshops and field trips happening in and out of p:ear

Art Workshops:

Actively make art with youth while also creating, collaborating, and coordinating artistic workshops with multiple mediums that work in tandem with the p:ear Art Gallery and Going Places program

- Create themes for gallery shows and coordinate workshops
- Secure artists for workshops that stimulate creative expression, joy and a sense of pride in youth
- Recruit and mentor both community guest artists and in-house artists that instruct youth in a variety of different art mediums
- Maintain and organize art supplies and track donations
- Insure appropriate materials are available for workshops
- Expand community partnerships to increase workshop & programmatic offerings
- Build and maintain relationships with individuals and local businesses to facilitate in-kind services and material donations
- Facilitate BIPOC artist-in-residence program including the recruitment and onboarding of a diverse group of engaging artists and offering the support and direction they need to succeed

Art Gallery:

Display and sell youth art in the context of a professional gallery

- Secures guest artists for gallery
- Curate youth art
- Lead volunteers to organize art storage room, frame youth art, hang all art and maintain gallery space and walls
- Input youth and guest art, make labels and label art
- Responsible for all art from moment of intake, through storage to getting sold piece to buyer & all payments accounted for and distributed
- Hosts 1st Thursday
- Organizes 1st Thursday volunteers
- Responsible for creating off site shows in the community
- Increase vitality, exposure and sales in the gallery

p:ear Jam - p:ear's music program:

- Work with volunteers to foster a vibrant music experience for youth
- Insure both group and individual music lessons for youth
- Maintain inventory of musical instruments and equipment. Arrange for repairs, upkeep and replacement
- Partner with outside music based organizations

Going Places:

Introduces youth to new cultural experiences in the community:

- Makes and maintains strong and healthy relationships with music, theater, dance, etc. organizations to provide tickets for youth
- Insures youth are aware of events and have access to tickets

- Insure youth have transportation to and from venue
- Insure proper adult support at event

Tech Tuesday

- In collaboration with the p:ear Works program, facilitate the 8 week paid training program
- Create curriculum and engage volunteers to teach the Adobe creative suite to youth for computer and art skill building
- Partner with outside businesses and organizations to build out projects for each cohort; projects have included: skateboard, clothing and shoe design

Administrative / Organizational Support:

- Maintain accurate records & meet all database input needs when appropriate
- Actively participate in fundraising events of p:ear
- Represent p:ear in the community (at events, fundraisers, and learning opportunities)
- Attend and participate in weekly staff meetings and monthly in-service
- Manage Art program budget
